



This particular video is highlighting a tradition in concerts that you may not have known about. In Symphonies and Concertos, they usually have 4 movements. Some of these movements can sound like the end of the piece, when in fact it is only the end of movement 1 or 3! So you are not meant to clap until the very end of the 4th movement.
